Brief Description

The project is being implemented in eleven and refugee settlements

Gender injustices are propagated by social and gender norms, beliefs, and practices that limit access to Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) for women and girls and ending Gender-Based Violence in emergencies (GBViEs) and host communities.

Girls and boys reached with GBV/SRHR information in the 336 school clubs supported in 10 districts and 23 refugee settlements.

16,323 women and girls mentored by the women mentors, 7,000 highly vulnerable out of school girls (15-19) provided with life skills, livelihood and SRHR information in the 280 groups/clubs formed, 29,436 people reached by the 830 (416 male, 414 female) trained SASA Activists across the 11 districts, 971 male activists in the 105 MAG Groups were trained and reached 8500 people in the 105 sub-counties, and 14,811 people (9892 Males, 4919 females) reached by the 713 (489 male, 224 female) agriculture extension workers in 1250 farmer groups in the 109 sub-counties.

Problem Statement

Gender injustices are propagated by social and gender norms, beliefs, and practices that limit access to Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) for women and girls and ending Gender-Based Violence in emergencies (GBViEs) and host communities.

Intervention Approaches

CARE is a major implementing partner with strengths in Gender analysis, social norms change, and women's economic empowerment through its innovative approaches of Role Model Men and Boys (RMM&B) and Village savings and

Loans association (VSLA) in the refugee and host communities.

The project focuses on demand generation for access to quality SRHR & GBV services and promoting access to economic asset building opportunities among women and girls through community structures across all sub counties in consortium with reach a hand Uganda, Outbox.

This is an empowerment model that builds capacity of RMM&B and women and girls in VSLA/YSLA to demand for SRHR/GBV services at service points including health facilities, police, and courts of law among women and girl's as individuals to live in dignity.



Expected results

Primary Schools

400 Primary & **48** secondary schools across in **11** districts & **23** refugee settlements.

Refugee Volunteers

136 supported to provide services in **46** women safe spaces

Groups of Farmers

13,200 reached across **8** districts in **5 years** (10 groups per trained officer in years 1-5)

Male Action Groups (MAGs)

98 established and each MAG comprising of **15** people trained in with **1,470** male activists engaged in MAGS and each MAG is attached to **10** households per year for the five years.

Districts

824 livelihood staff and CSO personnel trained (5 per sub county) + **170** CSO personnel trained in the settlements (5 per settlement * 34 settlement) = **660** staff - [simplify].

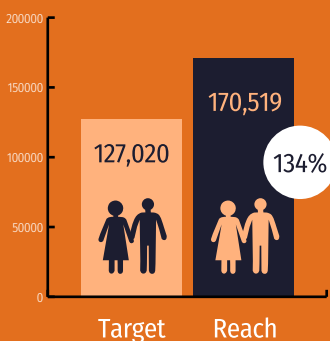
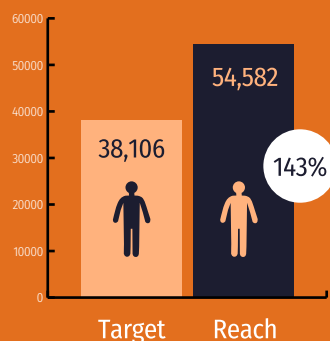
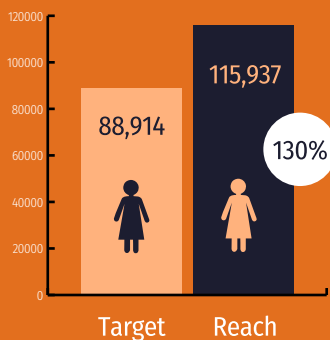
YSLA Agents

98 YSLA agents reaching out to 288 out of school girls' clubs and **8,640** members.

Community Activists

08 selected per sub-county in the 8 target districts and **98** sub counties and each reaches **40** people per month.

WAY Project Status Update



Project Innovations

CARE is working with midwives in over 105 sub counties to train members of community structures to build mobilisation capacity for uptake of sexual reproductive health and GBV services.

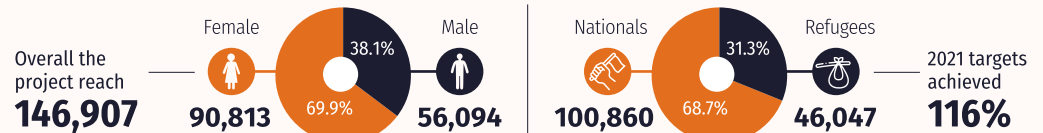
CARE has trained women safe space volunteers in making of re-useable sanitary pads and procured materials to enable women and girls reduce

costs during their menstrual periods as well as promote hygiene.

CARE is working through volunteers at women safe spaces to reach out to women and girls in the settlements to engage in income generation activities for economic empowerment and improve access to other needed services.

CARE is using extension workers and re-tooled them through trainings in gender, gender based violence and sexual reproductive health and rights to enable them integrate such knowledge in their livelihoods activities to promote joint decisions and harmony at household for increased and sustained agricultural productivity.

Project Achievements



33,913 School girls & boys reached with GBV/SRHR information in the 336 school clubs supported in 10 districts and 23 refugee settlements

3,256 Girls supported with menstrual hygiene information and materials and 1,366 boys.

3,211 people participating in women spaces established (3058F and 153M)

16,323 women and girls mentored by women mentors (10,236 women, 7176 girls)

8,047 vulnerable out of school girls provided with life skills

711 teachers trained 422 Males and 349 Females trained

29,436 people identified and oriented across 11 districts

19,436 People reached (9487F, 9949 M) by the 830 (416 males, 414 female) trained SASA Activists across the 11 districts.

46,153 People reached (13,846 Males, 32,307 females) by the 713 (489 males, 224 female) agriculture extension workers in 1688 farmer groups in the 109 sub-counties.

1,061 male activists in the 105 MAG Groups were trained and reached 42,500 people (25,500F, 17,000M) in the 105 sub-counties.
